Coverage of any service is determined by a member's eligibility, benefit limits for the service or services rendered and the application of the Plan's Medical Policy. Final payment is subject to the application of claims adjudication edits common to the industry and the **Plan's professional or facility services claims coding policies**. Reimbursement is restricted to the provider's scope of practice as well as the fee schedule applicable to that provider.

Purpose/ Application	To define how the Plan defines Place of Service (POS) codes that are billed on a professional claim.
Scope	Applies to all Premera Blue Cross, Premera Blue Cross Blue Shield of Alaska, LifeWise Health Plan of Washington, LifeWise Assurance Company and Premera Blue Cross HMO lines of business and products.
Policy	<p>Place of Service codes (POS) represent the location where a service was performed or received (e.g., Inpatient facility setting, Outpatient facility setting, patient's home, provider's office, treatment center, ambulatory surgery center, urgent care center, etc.) or where an item is being used.</p> <p>This POS code is a required field on the CMS-1500 paper claim form in block 24B indicated by the two-digit code. On an 837P electronic claim form, the required POS code is in loop 2300/CLM05-1 – Facility Code Value.</p> <p>When a CPT or HCPCS code description or other coding guidelines contain a reference to a specific place of service or indicates where a service can be performed, a corresponding POS code must be coded/billed to avoid a denial due to POS conflict. Some examples are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 94002- Ventilation assist and management, initiation of pressure or volume preset ventilators for assisted or controlled breathing; <i>hospital inpatient/observation, initial day.</i> • 99341 - Home or residence visit for the evaluation and management of a new patient, which requires a medically appropriate history and/or examination and straightforward medical decision making. When using total time on the date of the encounter for code selection, 15 minutes must be met or exceeded. • 99223 - Initial hospital inpatient or observation care, per day, for the evaluation and management of a patient, which requires a medically appropriate history and/or examination and high level of medical decision making. When using total time on the date of the encounter for code selection, 75 minutes must be met or exceeded.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 99284 -Emergency department visit for the evaluation and management of a patient, which requires a medically appropriate history and/or examination and moderate level of medical decision making • G0513 - Prolonged preventive service(s) (beyond the typical service time of the primary procedure), in the office or other outpatient setting requiring direct patient contact beyond the usual service; first 30 minutes (list separately in addition to code for preventive service) • S9326 - Home infusion therapy, continuous (24 hours or more) pain management infusion; administrative services, professional pharmacy services, care coordination and all necessary supplies and equipment (drugs and nursing visits coded separately), per diem <p>Correct Place of Service code submissions are being enforced during claims editing.</p>

Special Coding Considerations:

Registered Inpatients

When services are rendered to a **registered inpatient**, the provider furnishing services to that registered inpatient must report services with an appropriate inpatient POS code irrespective of the setting where the patient receives the face-to-face encounter. For example, POS 31, for a registered patient in a SNF, POS 51, for a patient registered in a

Psychiatric Inpatient Facility, or POS 61 for patients registered in a Comprehensive Inpatient Rehabilitation Facility

Ambulatory Surgery Center

When services are rendered in a certified ambulatory surgery center or a patient is registered in an ambulatory surgery center, POS 24 must be billed.

Diagnostic Laboratory Tests:

The place of service where the procedure is performed and who owns the equipment is used to determine which provider is able to bill for the components (technical, professional, or global) of the lab service. Applicable POS codes include but are not limited to:

- 11 - Office
- 19 – Off-campus Outpatient Hospital Clinic
- 21 – Inpatient Hospital
- 22 – On-campus Outpatient Hospital Clinic
- 24 – Ambulatory Surgical Center
- 81 - Independent Lab

When the patient specimen originates in the Physician office setting and ONLY the pathologist performs the Professional component:

- Pathologist bills with POS 11 and modifier 26 on the lab test(s)
- Technical component is performed and billed by an entity other than the pathology provider

When the patient specimen originates in either the Outpatient Hospital facility or Inpatient Hospital facility setting:

- If the technical component is performed by the hospital owned lab, the Hospital bills the lab service with modifier TC, and
- If the professional component is performed by an outside Pathologist, the Pathologist bills with POS 19, 21, or 22 with modifier 26
- If the Hospital performs the “global” portion of the lab test(s) (both technical and professional components) in the hospital owned lab and the pathologist is an employee of the hospital, the hospital bills the global code with no modifiers and no separate professional billing is allowed.

When the patient specimen is obtained from a Physician Office or Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) and BOTH the technical component and professional components are performed by an outside lab:

- All tests are billed with POS 81

Telehealth/Telemedicine Services

The POS code billed for services rendered to a member via telehealth must represent the physical location of **where the member is physically located when they are receiving the service**, whether in the member’s home (10) or a location other than the member’s home (02).

Durable Medical Equipment

The POS code on the claim should reflect where the member will be using the piece of equipment **for the majority of the time** (ex. In the home = POS 12).

Violations of Policy	Violations of this policy by any party that enters a written arrangement with the Plan may result in increased auditing and monitoring, performance guarantee contractual penalties, and/or termination of the contract. Disciplinary actions will be determined by the plan.
Exceptions	Exceptions to the policy may be made where a provider or employer group contract dictates otherwise.
