Coverage of any service is determined by a member's eligibility, benefit limits for the service or services rendered and the application of the Plan's Medical Policy. Final payment is subject to the application of claims adjudication edits common to the industry and the **Plan's professional or facility services claims coding policies**. Reimbursement is restricted to the provider's scope of practice as well as the fee schedule applicable to that provider.

<b>Purpose/ Application</b>	To define the Plan's limitations on reimbursement of dental and medical Personal Protective Equipment when submitted on a CMS-1500 paper claim form or an 837P electronic claim form.
<b>Scope</b>	Applies to all Premera Blue Cross, Premera Blue Cross Blue Shield of Alaska, LifeWise Health Plan of Washington, LifeWise Assurance Company and Premera Blue Cross HMO lines of business and products.
<b>Definitions</b>	<b>Personal Protective equipment (PPE):</b> Masks, gowns, gloves, face shields, shoe covers, protective barriers and cleaning protocols used to protect healthcare providers, both dental and medical, clinical staff and other qualified healthcare professionals during a patient encounter.
<b>Policy</b>	The use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) worn as part of a dental or medical healthcare visit is considered part of business operations for the patient encounter.  PPE is considered part of practice expenses included in the main procedure(s)/service performed and is not separately reimbursable.
<b>Codes and Coding Guidelines</b>	<b>Code 99072</b> - <i>Additional supplies, materials, and clinical staff time over and above those usually included in an office visit or other non-facility service(s), when performed during a Public Health Emergency, as defined by law, due to respiratory-transmitted infectious disease.</i>  This code is considered a Status B- <i>Bundled service code</i> and is not separately reimbursed.
<b>Violations of Policy</b>	Violations of this policy by any party that enters into a written arrangement with the Plan may result in increased auditing and monitoring, performance guarantee contractual penalties and/or termination of the contract. Disciplinary actions will be determined at Plan's sole discretion.  Violations of this policy may be grounds for corrective action, up to and including termination of employment.
